Question One (Compulsory)

Question Two

To what extent does Hardy's literary career straddles two significant literary milieus, the realist and modernist? Use his novel Jude the Obscure to discuss this. (15 marks)

Question Three

Discuss how Tolstoy uses different characters and conflicts in Anna Karenina to reveal the different aspects of life in Russian in the 19th Century.

Question Four

Referring to any two poems by T.S Elliot studied in the course, critique the poet's main concerns and how they relate to the modernist era he was writing in. (15 marks)

Question Five

Focusing on either Toni Morrison's *Beloved or Caryl Phillips' Crossing the River*, explain the writer's role as an alternative voice and witness to what had hitherto been silenced in Western canonical texts. (10 marks)
